COURSE AIM:

To introduce participants to the interface between disability and safeguarding.

To recognise ways in which disabled children can be more vulnerable to harm.

Identify some of the attitudes and values that affect perception of the abuse of disabled children and the parental capacity of disabled adults.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- To consider the local context relating to children with disabilities
- To explore attitudes to disabilities and why this can increase vulnerability
- To consider the issues faced by parents of disabled children and to be confident to improve partnership with parents
- To discuss factors that can make a child with disabilities more vulnerable to abuse and neglect
- To identify the signs and indicators of abuse and neglect, including subtle signs across the diverse range of disabilities
- To recognise the perceived barriers to communicating with disabled children
- Consider your role and responsibilities and know how to respond to concerns
